PROBLEMS_

(in no special order):

- There is no documentation
- There is too much documentation
- Documentation is out-of-date
- Nobody wants to write documentation
- Developers suck at writing good documentation

CONSEQUENCES OF POOR DOCUMENTATION_

- Slow on-boarding of new hires
- Reduced productivity
- Longer time to recover from production outages
- Technical debt
- Slow update of new features
- Poor communication
- Blame culture
- Higher people turnover

Individuals and interactions over processes and tools


WHAT IS DOCS-AS-CODE?

- Also referred to as Documentation-as-Code and Docs-like-Code
- You treat your documentation as you treat your code
- You use the same workflow and tooling (e.g. git, pull requests, tests, CI/CD workflow)
- Benefits: Fosters collaboration (e.g. via PR reviews), automate boring tasks (spell checking and find typos), speed up deployment, and contribute to keep docs up-to-date

CONTINUOUS DOCUMENTATION_

Continuous Documentation is the process of creating and updating documentation incrementally and as part of the development workflow.

Code and its documentation are in sync.

DOCS STRATEGY_

- Define your documentation goals
- Start small and iterate
- Whenever possible stick to a single or a consistent place for storing your documentation
- Create a style guide according to your organization's standards (tone, voice, wording, writing style, and branding)

TESTING_

Code Tests

Test your code snippets as you test your code (unit testing, code style, linting, , etc.)

Content Tests

- Spell check and grammar check
- Link check
- Style check (e.g. using <u>Vale</u>)

CUSTOMER FACING DOCS_

- <u>Swagger</u>/OpenAPI for documenting APIs
- Check accessibility, performance, SEO (e.g. using <u>Lighthouse</u>).
- Refer to the docs when supporting your customers (RTFM).

- 2. Read the Docs

STATIC SITE GENERATOR_

A static site generator is a tool generating a full static HTML website based on raw data and templates.

- Good for single code repository and small size docs
- Markdown as markup language
- Use a docs directory in the code repo or a dedicated docs repo

SOLUTIONS

- Sphinx, Jekyll & GitHub Pages, Hugo, etc.
- Can be hosted on a cloud object store like Amazon
 S3, Azure Blob, Google Storage, etc.
- Can use a Content Delivery Network (CDN) for caching and performance

FEATURES

- Simple deployment workflow
- Local development environment
- Speed, performance, and security (static content)

STATIC SITE GENERATOR DEMO_

READ THE DOCS_

- Read the Docs is an open source documentation hosted platform.
- Good for medium-size docs

Markdown too

ReStructuredText as markup language, supports

FEATURES

- Full text search and versioning included
- Automatic deployment
- Publish it via an external service (readthedocs.io)
 or host your own
- Can generated PDF and ebook manuals

READ THE DOCS DEMO_

ANTORA_

Antora is an open source multi-repository documentation site generator.

- Good for multiple code repositories and large size docs
- AsciiDoc as markup language, supports Markdown too

FEATURES

- Aggregate content from multiple repositories in a single documentation website
- Multiple teams can manage their own docs
- AsciiDoc powerful yet simple syntax
- No need for plugins, shortcodes, or extensions
